## Key information for units in the Great Southwest Council!

- Be A Scout “Pins” are a key way for units to have an online presence to help with recruiting through the [beascout.org](https://beascout.org) website. Keeping the Pins current is important; the next page shows a council and district-level view of how we’re doing in presenting information to non-Scouters interested in joining Scouting. Unit Key 3 can log into [my.scouting.org](https://my.scouting.org) and go to the Organization Manager function. There’s an option there on the left side of the page to change Pin settings.
- Training information:

  - For Troops, on August 3<sup>rd</sup>, BSA is releasing updated training for Scoutmasters & Assistants, Committee Chairs and Committee Members, and Merit Badge Counselors. See the second page following this one for details
- Though we’re still in the midst of social distancing, it’s never too early to think about Fall recruiting. The third page following this one has some suggestions to consider as we build our recruiting strategy.
- A reminder that a list of advancement or other items needed from the Scout Shop can be emailed to them at [highdesertscoutshop@scouting.org](mailto:highdesertscoutshop@scouting.org). Units can then call and do payment over the phone so all they have to do is walk in to pick up the order or pay when they pick up. They just need to make sure they let the store know when they are planning to pick up. It would be great to have at least 2 days notice as there is currently only one staff member working.

Be A Scout pins are a way to provide information to individuals searching online for a Scout unit. It's a great tool for recruiting, but only if Unit Key 3 are actively managing it, using the Unit Pin feature under Organization Manager in my.scouting.org. So how are we doing?

- First, the good news... every unit in the council appears on the BeAScout.org website (all units have Active 'pins'.)
  - However, only 63% of units (90/144) have unit information being displayed by having their Pin View set to "Unit". The remaining units are just showing council information (Pin View is set to "Council")
  - Do units allow online applications; i.e., is the Online Application feature set to Active? Only about 35% do (50/144)
  - Is there any contact information listed for someone from the unit? Yes, for about 72% (103 of 144)
  - Is there a link to a unit website? ("website" includes traditional "www" links, google sites, Facebook pages, Instagram accounts, etc. Basically anything that refers someone to something besides [www.scouting.org](http://www.scouting.org) [BSA National website] or [www.gswcbsa.org](http://www.gswcbsa.org) [council website]) The answer is... Ouch... only 27% of units (38/144) have something that links directly to them
  - Finally, has the pin had some sort of update this year? 76% have (109/144)
- So... where does YOUR unit fall into each of these categories? Need more information; check out <https://www.scouting.org/resources/online-registration/>

# New Scouts BSA Training

- A new online/facilitated version of the Scouts BSA (Troop-level) training will be available on August 3rd. If you are currently completing the training please complete prior to this date as BSA will be changing the Learning Plans for all positions – Scoutmaster/Assistant Scoutmaster, Committee Chair, Committee Member and Merit Badge Counselor. If you do not complete by August 3rd you will have to restart the training using the new learning plans and modules.
- The new online learning combines content resulting in fewer modules. BSA has also streamlined courses to help reduce the total time it takes to complete the training. The new facilitated course uses offline versions of the learning modules to facilitate maintenance on any future changes - thus the online and facilitated content are simultaneously updated to ensure consistency in the versions of the training.
- Please note: Completion of the appropriate portion of the Scouts BSA facilitated session will meet the requirements for.
  - Scoutmaster & Assistant Scoutmaster: S24 Scoutmaster Specific Training
  - Merit Badge Counselor: D76 Merit Badge Counselor Orientation Training
  - Troop Committee Chair & Committee: WS10 Troop Committee Challenge

# Recruiting Suggestions

- **Here are some suggestions from a recent Area 6 Membership and Recruiting meeting that your unit might want to consider as you plan your Fall recruiting strategy:**
- We need to start recruiting now! Other organizations have already started doing the same.
- Every unit activity should hold a recruiting aspect. If you are hosting a PWD, or a regular Pack, Troop, or Patrol meeting, think about how you can advertise for new families to join.
- We MUST share our success. Share tools and ideas from all over BSA. Many Councils are offering ideas and even login info for virtual events. We do not need to reinvent the wheel. If we know something works share it. Share the How To's
- Utilize technology - ALL units should have a Facebook page. Gone are the days of looking for websites.
- Schedule your recruiting now and early so you have more options in the fall for back up events. If your first event doesn't yield the results you are looking for holding the event earlier in the season gives more time to recruit in the fall.
- Consider a "try us out first" approach to new members. Scouting is one of the few organizations that we charge a join fee before the family gets a chance to know what it is all about. Consider having families pay a portion of the registration fee up front and the final fee after they have attended a few meetings.
- Look at using geofencing to advertise... but know you can't utilize geofencing without Facebook . Geofencing is location based advertising. This tool is used through Facebook. When a unit creates an event, let's say for recruiting, they can send that event out for the general public to receive. Geofencing allows it to be sent to a certain demographic in a specific area. This is a feature only for Facebook. Units can ask that the event be created on Council or District pages if they do not have their own page. However, every unit should try to get their own Facebook page.
- USE other online tools besides Geofencing,. Ex: QR codes, BeAScout, PeachJar
- Peer to Peer recruiting incentives. Really push the recruiter patch for Scouts to earn. Offer other incentives if needed. A few suggestions would be; unit T-shirt, registration discount, Build it kits, etc.
- Reach further into the community for "word of mouth", Local officials, police dept., Fire dept. etc. Units should be reaching out to community members to ask what they can do to help the community. This can build relationships as well as offer opportunities for Scouting to get back in the face of the community.

# Strat Plan Area: 5.2.1

## Unit Contacts

(Goal: 45% of units have 6 or more contacts, including one DA [Council JTE Gold])

This page looks at the critical unit-service area of unit contacts, which falls under Council JTE Criteria #16. The JTE criteria requires at least six contacts per year, with one a Detailed Assessment. This chart helps determine how a district is doing on both contacts, detailed assessments, and the combination of the two which determines the success in meeting the JTE criteria. Data is from a Council-level "District\_Contact\_Stats" report. In 2018, 40% of our units met this criteria, which equates to a Silver rating for JTE in this area. In 2019, 51% of the units met the criteria, which earned Gold. The challenge for 2020 is to continue the trend!

### Units with JTE Bronze or Higher

This page looks at the how many units achieve JTE level Bronze or higher, which falls under District JTE Criteria #14. Districts that achieve 50% earn Bronze; 60% are Silver, and 75% are Gold. JTE forms are normally collected at the end of the calendar year, as part of the recharter process.

## Ratio of Units per UC

(Goal: 3.0 or less)

Having enough UCs to cover all units, without overburdening the UC with too many units to provide effective service, requires that we look at that ratio. This metric does just that! The data on number of units for the report is from looking at the number of units in the District\_Contact\_Stats report, and commissioner assignments from those shown as registered as UCs in the “TrainedLeader\_Great\_Southwest\_Council\_412” training report.

# Strat Plan Area: 5.3.3

## Packs have a UC

(Goal: 100% of Packs have a UC assigned)

Having strong packs that excite youth about Scouting is critical to retaining the youth as they age-up to become eligible for Scouts BSA, Venturing, and Exploring. Having commissioners assigned to the unit helps to ensure strong packs. The data is from the Assigned\_Units and Unassigned\_Units reports in Commissioner Tools.

# Strat Plan Areas 5.4

## Partnership for Scouting (PFS)

The Council's Scouting Partnership initiative, started in 2017, is an effort to recognize those units that meet certain goals for program, camping, and financial support of the Council.

### 2020 Partnership Status Criteria

- \$175 per registered youth, via FOS contributions, beef jerky or popcorn sales, Gondola Patrol, or other donations to the Council
- Attend a Council-sponsored day camp (packs) or attend Gorham for scout camp (troops) at least once every three years; Crews need to achieve Bronze or higher for Crew JTE Criteria #4, Adventure
  - Note: How to apply this criteria since summer camp and day camps have been cancelled due to the pandemic is being discussed**
- Earn overall JTE Bronze or higher
  - Note: BSA National has indicated that revisions will probably be made to JTE criteria once the impact of the pandemic is better understood**

### Partnership Status Recognition

- Rebate of \$25 insurance fee
- 10% rebate for day camps and Gorham Scout Ranch fees
- Free Eagle Scout/Summit Award presentation kits
- Free cloth and card for rank advancement
- Free use of Gorham Scout Ranch in the off-season
- 10% off camping gear at High Desert Scout Shop
- Free basic training for all adult leaders
- 10% off Wood Badge, Brownsea and NYLT training
- 5% bonus commission for take order popcorn sales
- Free Journey to Excellence patches
- Free Pinewood Derby Cars for packs

  - Deadline: 6/30/2020
- 5.4.3-Promotion of PFS
  - Goal: Produce a new brochure promoting PFS
  - Deadline: 1/31/2021

## Units without Commissioners

(Goal: minimize the number of units without a UC assigned)

To have effective unit-level commissioner service, there needs to be 'ownership' of a unit (or units) by a UC. While not a Strategic Plan goal, tracking units without a commissioner assigned provides feedback on either making sure a commissioner has been assigned administratively, or show the need to recruit additional commissioners. Data is from the Unassigned\_Units report in Commissioner Tools.
